# Guidelines and Principles for Track and Field Licensing 2021-22

As I'm sure you will be aware the UK Government has announced the roadmap out of lockdown for England, likewise the Scottish Government have announced the pathway for Scotland whilst in Wales dates and details of how restriction will be eased have yet to be released. In Northern Ireland more information is expected to be announced on March 1<sup>st</sup>.

We are all keen to see the return of training and competition at all levels of the sport across the UK, however there are still some things that are unknown and the Home Country Athletics Federations (HCAFs; England Athletics, Scottish Athletics, Welsh Athletics and Athletics Northern Ireland) are working hard to ensure updated guidance is available as quickly as possible as more information becomes available.

Licences will be issued, but we ask organisers to take responsibility for informing both UKA Track & Field licensing and Home Country organisations of any changes that occur through the process of restrictions being eased that will impact and prevent their event from taking place.

We fully appreciate that this season has and will continue to be challenging and impacted by the pandemic. We recognise that some pragmatism may be required under the circumstances however, the guidelines and principles of licensing are set out below.

## Licences:

- Level 1 licences will be issued by the four HCAFs and Level 2 by UKA.
- On application to the UK Athletics Licence process, organisers apply for a Level 1 licence, but will be given the opportunity to request consideration for upgrading to Level 2. A history of successful competition at that level, a high standard of competitors, as well as fulfilling all Level 2 licensing requirements is a necessity.
- Events seeking World Para Athletics accreditation must meet all Level 2 Licence requirements.
- Licence applications should be submitted early, but an absolute minimum notice period of 10 days

## Facilities:

• With safety in mind ALL licensed events (both Level 1 and Level 2) must be held at venues that have achieved or are actively working towards TrackMark accreditation (a separate

- Licensed Level 2 competitions involving Hammer, Discus or Weight Throw will only be approved at venues if the throws cage meets World Athletics specifications (i.e. from a cage with a hammer danger zone of no more than 56° and a discus danger zone of no more than 69°). Contact <u>ehunt@englandathletics.org</u> for further information or guidance.
- Where Level 1 Licence applications include Hammer, Discus or Weight Throw events within the competition and their throws cage has not been formally assessed, an agreement to undertake a risk assessment will be necessary. These events will not be allowed to take place if the cage has failed its safety inspection. Contact <u>ehunt@englandathletics.org</u> for further information or guidance.

### Conditions:

- Competitions must be delivered under UKA Rules for Competition or World Athletics Technical Rules and where appropriate World Para Athletics Rules will also apply.
- The competition must meet the criteria as per the level assigned to it.
- All Results, in the appropriate format, must be sent directly to Power of 10 as agreed by UKA and the HCAF.
- Only competitions results with a valid licence will be accepted by Power of 10.
- Please Note: results may be assessed as part of a "spot check" exercise and Event
  Organisers contacted to verify details, including the names & URN's of the qualified officials
  on duty. If an event has not been delivered to the standard indicated in the application the
  licence may be withdrawn retrospectively by the issuing body.
- All events applied for within the Competition Licence Application Form, must correspond with the specific UKA Rules for each age group and be appropriate for the age and ability of the athlete. Northern Ireland will correspond to AAI Rules for each age group championships
- Licence applications will be approved in line with the published fixture calendar and clear clashes of interest will be avoided.

#### Records

• If UK Records are likely to be set, any Record Application will have to be signed by Referees or Chiefs in the relevant disciplines who are Level 4.

Licences will not be issued until all matters have been resolved. If there are any outstanding issues, the date is not awarded until you receive the licence. Dates agreed through the annual Fixture Planning process will take precedence in all cases.

Please do not hesitate to contact us for any further clarification you may require and may we take this opportunity to thank you for your co-operation in these challenging times. It is essential that we work together to create a competition pathway which demonstrates that we have the welfare



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and safety of the athletes at the centre of our decision making as well as providing a safe and enjoyable environment for all those involved in delivery competition.
