UKA RULES FOR COMPETITION 2024 - 2026

Summary of Rule Changes

The 2024 – 2026 UKA Rule Book is the fifth edition that we have linked to the World Athletics (WA) rule book and once again we can report that there are no changes to the structure of the book or to rule numbers. UKA Rule changes are summarised in the table below.

Points to note include:

- Rules are divided into Competition and Technical categories and numbered from CR1 and TR1 respectively.
- Where rules apply to competition in the UK but are not incorporated in World Athletics we have
 placed them in a UKA General section, which follows the Competition and Technical sections and
 is numbered from G1. The full set of WA rules can be found at <u>Book of Rules | Official Documents</u>
 <u>(worldathletics.org)</u>. WA continue to omit an index, but, to assist the user in finding the
 appropriate Rule or UKA Supplement, we have included a comprehensive index at the back of the
 UKA Rule Book.
- Lines down the side of a page indicate where Rule changes have been made.
- World Athletics now update their Rules on two or three occasions during the two year life of the Rule Book. These changes will be made to the UKA Rule Book maintained at <u>Rules of</u> <u>Competition | UK Athletics</u>. It is expected that WA will not produce a hard copy rule book in the future.
- Shoe Rule: WA do not include the shoe rule in the rule book but it is in a separate document 'Athletics Shoe Regulations' alongside the rule book at <u>Book of Rules | Official Documents</u> <u>(worldathletics.org)</u>. WA maintain an Approved Shoe List (which is frequently updated) and which can be downloaded at <u>https://worldathletics.org/about-iaaf/documents/technicalinformation</u> in the 'Athletics Shoes' tab (or navigate from the WA Home page via Library>Technical Information>Athletic Shoes). The UKA guidance previously posted is being reviewed and will be published at <u>Rules of Competition | UK Athletics.</u>
- The UKA Rule Book will continue to be accessible at <u>Rules of Competition | UK Athletics</u> and the hard copy can be purchased at <u>www.neuff.co.uk</u>, email <u>sales@neuff.co.uk</u> and telephone 01752 893742.
- The cover price is now £6.50 (the first price increase since 2002!) with an additional charge for delivery.

Changes to World Athletics Rules are summarised in a World Athletics document that has been issued to all Technical Officials.

World Athletics have amended the specification for the 700g Javelin and this
will come into force from April 1 st 2025.
This will enable all road race Competition Providers to restrict the use of all
forms of headphones in any race regardless of the nature of the course,
including on courses closed to traffic.
A new rule to ban pacing in Road Races has been added to the Road Racing
section to reinforce TR6.3.1 which bans pacing generally.
Notes have been added to indicate that these World Athletics Rules do not
apply to UK Domestic Trail races.
The rule defining refreshment station requirements has been updated to
remove possible ambiguity.
Clubs that recruit members from across the UK may enter competitions which
require a birth or residential qualification although their club may not be based
in that particular location. This is subject to any local conditions or rules that
the Competition Provider may apply through Rule G2 S4(6).
Athletes may only compete in the Championships of one District within each of
the six month periods commencing 1st April or 1st October.
