



**2024 World Para Athletics Championships: 17 – 25 May 2024  
Kobe, Japan**

Selection Policy – Published Monday 9<sup>th</sup> October 2023

**OVERVIEW**

This selection policy outlines the process by which UK Athletics will select the team to represent Great Britain & Northern Ireland at the 2024 World Para Athletics Championships (“2024 WPA Championships”).

**AIM**

UK Athletics’ aim is to provide qualification opportunities and, in exceptional circumstances only, global international competition opportunities to support medal success at the 2024 Paralympic Games only. Therefore, Athletes who have obtained a qualification slot through previous allocation method(s) (including by finishing in top 4 at the 2023 Para athletics World Championships) will only be considered for selection in the exceptional circumstances set out in this Policy.

**SELECTION MEETING**

1. The team will be selected on **8<sup>th</sup> April 2024**.
2. The Selection Panel will select up to a maximum of 25 athletes in Paris 2024 Medal Event Programme events only.
3. In all track events and single class field events, a maximum of three (3) eligible athletes may be entered per medal event (single class).
4. In combined field events a maximum of five (5) eligible athletes may be selected, with a maximum of three (3) eligible athletes per single class.

**SECTION 1: ELIGIBILITY FOR CONSIDERATION FOR SELECTION**

5. To be eligible for consideration for selection, athletes must comply with requirements 1 and 2 below:

Requirement 1 (Eligibility Criteria):	Meet the Eligibility Criteria, as set out in Appendix 1 – Eligibility Criteria.
Requirement 2 (Qualification Standard):	Achieve a Minimum Entry Standard as listed in Appendix 2 – Minimum Entry Standards, in the correct period (as set out in paragraph 9 below).

### **Requirement 1: Eligibility Criteria**

6. To be considered for selection, athletes must satisfy the Eligibility Criteria set out in Appendix 1 – Eligibility Criteria.

### **Requirement 2: Qualification Standard**

7. Athletes must achieve at least one (1) Minimum Entry Standard (“MES”) performance (as set out in Appendix 2) at a World Para Athletics (“WPA”) Recognised Competition for each event in which they wish to be considered for selection.
8. The MES must be achieved between 00:00 (GMT) 1<sup>st</sup> January 2023 and 00:00 (BST) 7<sup>th</sup> April 2024 (inclusive).
9. Performances will only be accepted towards the MES if they are in accordance with Section 3: Performance Conditions.

### **Eligible Athletes**

10. Athletes who achieve Requirements 1 and 2 will be eligible for consideration for selection (“Eligible Athletes”). Other athletes will not be eligible for consideration for selection.

## **SECTION 2: SELECTION PROCESS**

### **Direct Invitations**

12. In exceptional circumstances, where previous World or Paralympic medallist/s who have demonstrated current form and fitness, have not, in the sole view of the Selection Panel, had the opportunity to achieve an MES, the Selection Panel may decide on **14<sup>th</sup> March 2024** to submit a formal request to WPA for a direct invitation.
13. WPA has the discretion to directly invite athletes whether on the basis of requests by UK Athletics or on its own initiative.
14. If direct invitations are issued by WPA, these will be considered by the Selection Panel on a case-by-case basis.
15. Direct invitations will only be eligible for acceptance if:
  - a. the athlete concerned has demonstrated to the satisfaction of the Selection Panel, current form and fitness which suggests they have realistic potential to gain a qualification slot for the 2024 Paralympic Games; and
  - b. the maximum number of GB & NI athletes for the same event has not already been reached across all rounds set out below.
16. Whether any direct invitations are accepted is at the sole discretion of the Selection Panel. The Selection Panel may reach a determination in relation to direct invitations at the selection meeting or the Selection Panel may convene a further meeting (which

may be by telephone conference and attended only by the voting members of the Selection panel) in order to determine whether to accept any direct invitations issued.

### **Selection Rounds**

17. The Selection Panel will select athletes in three (3) rounds.

In Round 1, the Selection Panel may select Eligible Athletes for more than one event (“doubling up”). An athlete selected in one event will also be selected in another event if that athlete meets the relevant criteria. With all doubling it will be allowed at the discretion of the Selection Panel who will consider the impact of the athlete doubling up, including on their performance in their primary event and on any other athlete who may achieve a qualification slot in that second event.

#### **18. Round 1 – 2023 WPA Championships attendees**

- a. Athletes who were selected to compete at the 2023 WPA Championships and did not finish in the top four (4) will be discussed in this round.
- b. Athletes will only be selected for individual events in this round if they have demonstrated to the satisfaction of the Selection Panel, current form and fitness which suggests they have realistic potential to obtain a Paris 2024 Paralympic Games qualification slot AND go on to win a medal at the Paris 2024 Paralympic Games.
- c. Athletes will be discussed in order of the 2024 WPA Championship MES Rankings but, for the avoidance of doubt, selections will not necessarily be made in order of rankings.
- d. Where there are more than three (3) Eligible Athletes per event, athletes will be selected for any remaining places based on the following factors, which may be given such weight as the Selection Panel determines and any of which may be disregarded by the Selection Panel:
  - i. 2024 WPA Championship MES Rankings;
  - ii. Number of times MES have been achieved;
  - iii. WPA 2023 & 2024 World Rankings;
  - iv. Current form and fitness;
  - v. Performances in non-WPA approved competitions (results submitted to Powerof10);
  - vi. Results from 2023 World Para Athletics Championships and Tokyo 2020 Paralympic Games);
  - vii. Performance-limiting injury or illness;
  - viii. The relative strength of an event/class at previous Paralympic Games and World Championships;
  - ix. Athlete head-to-heads;
  - x. Paris 2024 Paralympic Games medal potential;
  - xi. Any other factors deemed relevant by the Selection Panel.

#### **19. Round 2 – 2024 WPA Championship MES Rankings:**

- a. This round only applies for an event if all 3 available selections for that event have not been made in Round 1.

- b. Athletes who are ranked in the top twelve (12) of the 2024 WPA Championship MES Rankings and did not attend the 2023 WPA Championships, will be discussed in this round.
- c. Athletes will only be selected for individual events in this round if they have demonstrated to the satisfaction of the Selection Panel, current form and fitness which suggests they have realistic potential to obtain a Paris 2024 Paralympic Games slot AND go on to win a medal at the Paris 2024 Paralympic Games.
- d. Athletes will be discussed in order of the 2024 WPA Championship MES Rankings but, for the avoidance of doubt, selections will not necessarily be made in order of rankings.
- e. Where there are more Eligible Athletes per event than there are slots remaining following Round 1, athletes will be selected for any remaining places after Round 1 selections based on the following factors, which may be given such weight as the Selection Panel determines and any of which may be disregarded by the Selection Panel:
  - i. 2024 WPA Championship MES Rankings;
  - ii. Number of times MES have been achieved;
  - iii. WPA 2023 & 2024 World Rankings;
  - iv. Current form and fitness;
  - v. Performances in non-WPA approved competitions (results submitted to Powerof10);
  - vi. Record at previous major senior championships (2023 World Para Athletics Championships, Tokyo 2020 Paralympic Games);
  - vii. Performance-limiting injury or illness;
  - viii. The relative strength of an event/class at previous Paralympic Games and World Championships;
  - ix. Athlete head-to-heads;
  - x. Paris 2024 Paralympic Games medal potential;
  - xi. Any other factors deemed relevant by the Selection Panel.

## 20. Round 3 – Remaining athletes

- a. Subject to spaces remaining in the team, this Round 3 only applies to 2023-24 World Class Programme athletes who have demonstrated to the satisfaction of the Selection Panel that the 2024 WPA Championships is vital in their preparation for the 2024 Paralympic Games.
- b. Eligible Athletes will only be considered if they have demonstrated to the satisfaction of the Selection Panel, in its absolute discretion, competition and training plans which suggest the 2024 WPA Championships significantly support them going on to win a medal at Paris 2024 Paralympic Games.
- c. The Selection Panel may consider the following factors, which may be given such weight as the Selection Panel determines and any of which may be disregarded by the Selection Panel:
  - i. Training & competition plans;

- ii. 2024 WPA Championship MES Rankings;
- iii. Number of times MES have been achieved;
- iv. WPA 2023 & 2024 World Rankings;
- v. Current form and fitness;
- vi. Performances in non-WPA approved competitions (results submitted to Powerof10);
- vii. Record at previous major senior championships (2023 World Para Athletics Championships, Tokyo 2020 Paralympic Games);
- viii. Performance-limiting injury or illness;
- ix. The relative strength of an event/class at previous Paralympic Games and World Championships;
- x. Athlete head-to-heads;
- xi. Paris 2024 medal potential; and
- xii. Any other factors deemed relevant by the Selection Panel.

**21. Round 4 – Additional Events:**

- a. Where Eligible Athletes have already been selected in Rounds 1-3 above, the Selection Panel may allow an athlete already selected in one individual event to be selected for additional individual events after the conclusion of all previous rounds, provided the athlete meets the requirements set out in paragraph 6, for the additional event(s).
- b. The Selection Panel cannot, in making selections in this round, override previous selections or preclude another athlete selected in previous rounds.
- c. In making their decision the Selection Panel will consider the following:
  - i. The impact on the athlete's preparation and performance of their primary event;
  - ii. The athlete's ability to finish in the top 8 in their secondary event; and
  - iii. The secondary event as a development opportunity for the athlete.

22. In relation to selections for places where athletes are compared and athletes considered have suffered from illness/injury, the Selection Panel may take their injury/illness into account as a reason not to select the athlete and, although it may do so in its sole discretion, there is no obligation on the Selection Panel take into account illness/injury as an exemption from the requirement to perform in the case of an athlete whose performances may have suffered due to illness/injury.

23. The team will be announced on **12<sup>th</sup> April 2024**.

*Important Note: The 2024 WPA Championships Event Programme will be confirmed following close of entries on **12<sup>th</sup> April 2024**. If the structure of any events change at this stage, for example if classes are combined or events become non-viable, the Selection Panel will reconsider any athletes originally selected in these events. Athletes may be deselected if they are no longer eligible or if the Selection Panel considers (in re-applying the provisions of paragraphs 18 to 23) that they do not meet the selection criteria for the new event.*

### **SECTION 3: PERFORMANCE CONDITIONS**

24. MES performances must be achieved in WPA endorsed competitions (see [WPA website](#) for a full list of domestic and overseas WPA endorsed events).
- a. Domestic, non-disabled competitions are not automatically endorsed or recognised by WPA for the purposes of achieving MES performances. Athletes may request WPA endorsement (via UK Athletics) for specific domestic non-disabled competitions in accordance with paragraph 26.b below provided the request satisfies the following:
    - i. The competition is an integrated event – i.e., either disability events take place in the same competition as non-disabled events OR a disabled athlete competes in a non-disabled event directly against non-disabled athletes; and
    - ii. The competition for which endorsement is being sought is a UKA Permit Level 2 or higher competition (for further details on UKA competition permits, please check [www.britishathletics.org.uk](http://www.britishathletics.org.uk)).
  - b. Athletes wishing to request WPA endorsement of a domestic, non-disabled, event must send requests to Jan Richards at [jrichards@britishathletics.org.uk](mailto:jrichards@britishathletics.org.uk), at least four (4) weeks prior to the start of the competition. The final decision as to whether such an event is endorsed shall be at the discretion of WPA.
25. In order for qualifying performances to be recognised by WPA, athletes must hold a 2024 WPA License at the commencement of the competition in which the performance was achieved. Athletes without a valid WPA license must submit new requests for a license at least one (1) week prior to the commencement of that competition. All requests must be submitted to Jan Richards at [jrichards@britishathletics.org.uk](mailto:jrichards@britishathletics.org.uk).
26. Wind-assisted performances (or performances achieved at events where wind measurement was not available) for events held completely in a stadium will not be accepted.
27. Indoor performances for all field events and all track events of 400m or longer will be accepted.
28. Hand timed performances in 100m, 200m & 400m will not be accepted.
29. Field event performances must be achieved using implements with a “minimum” weight, as outlined per classification (see [WPA website](#) for implement weights).
30. For the running events of 400m and over, performances achieved on oversized tracks will NOT be accepted.
31. 100m, 200m and 400m performances at altitudes of above 950m will not be accepted.

32. Performances achieved in mixed events between male and female participants, held completely in a stadium, shall not normally be accepted. Exceptions to this rule may be made for field events or races of 5,000m or longer provided the stipulations outlined in WPA rule 3.2.5 (including notes) are satisfied. For the avoidance of doubt, where any mixed gender race is conducted so as to allow athletes of one gender to be paced/drafted/assisted by athletes of another gender, the results will not be permissible for qualification/selection purposes. Whether or not a mixed gender race has been conducted in such a way will be determined at the absolute discretion of the Selection Panel.
33. Multiple performances achieved in the same individual event in a single day will count as follows:
  - a. In track events only the fastest legal result of the day;
  - b. In throwing events only, the best trial of the first competition of the day; and
  - c. In horizontal jumps only the best trial of the first competition of the day, unless every mark achieved by the athlete was wind-assisted (or the wind measurement was not available/recorded) in which case a second competition held under non-wind-assisted conditions will count.

#### **World ranking conditions relating to selection**

34. For events in which more than one class is eligible (such as F42/61/63 Shot Put), the combined WPA MES Ranking (based on unadjusted times/distances) will always be used for the purposes of the selection process.
35. 2024 WPA Championships MES Rankings will be taken at 09:00 (BST) on 8<sup>th</sup> April 2024. If the 2024 WPA Championships MES Rankings are known by the Head of Paralympic Performance to be inaccurate (i.e., missing performances) at this point, UK Athletics will manually input any missing results from the data set obtained from WPA. The data used during the selection process will be made available for any subsequent appeals.

#### **SECTION 4: SELECTION PANEL**

36. The Selection Panel (“the Selection Panel”) for the meeting shall comprise:
  - a. Voting members;
    - i. UK Athletics’ Head of Paralympic Performance;
    - ii. UK Athletics’ Paralympic Performance Lead; and
    - iii. Technical Director
  - b. The following persons shall attend the selection meeting, unless they are unable due to unforeseen circumstances:
    - i. Chairperson;
    - ii. Independent observer;
    - iii. UK Athletics’ Lead Paralympic Medical Officer or other medical representative as nominated by the Lead Paralympic Medical Officer;
    - iv. Note-takers.
  - c. The Technical Director may (but is not obliged to) invite any other person to attend the selection meeting including:

- i. Event group representatives;
  - ii. BPA Representative;
  - iii. UK Athletics Athlete Commission Member (if available);
  - iv. Legal counsel for UKA.
37. In the event of an actual, potential or possible conflict relating to any selector, the actual, potential or possible conflict shall be reported to the Chairperson of the selection meeting who shall determine whether the selector in question should be permitted to take part in relation to any selection decision(s). The Chairperson may appoint an alternative selector if necessary.
38. Voting of the Selection Panel shall be by simple majority. The Head of Paralympic Performance shall have a casting vote, if required. If the Head of Paralympic Performance is unable to vote due to a conflict, the Technical Director shall have a casting vote, if required.
39. The Selection Panel may make any selection subject to the athlete completing a performance requirement or test set by the Selection Panel.

## **SECTION 5: DE-SELECTION**

40. Following selection, an athlete may be de-selected by the Selection Panel or UK Athletics in the event of:
  - a. the athlete ceasing to comply with the eligibility criteria set out in this Selection Policy, or other strategy document communicated by UK Athletics;
  - b. the athlete's classification or classification status changing;
  - c. following application of the Medical De-Selection Protocol set out in the Team Member Agreement and World Class Programme Agreement;
  - d. any anti-doping rule violation or provisional suspension;
  - e. any serious misconduct or suspension due to misconduct;
  - f. any suspension due to intentional misrepresentation;
  - g. a breach of any UK Athletics policy including but not limited to the Relay Plan or Code of Conduct for International Athletes;
  - h. UK Athletics reasonably considering that the athlete will be unable to perform at the level required or expected due to any reason including loss of form or failure to recover fully or as expected from injury or illness; or
  - i. failure to opt-in to team training or events.

In the event of de-selection, the Selection Panel will meet again to decide on a replacement athlete. In the event there is not time for the Selection Panel to meet, the decision will be taken



by the Technical Director and Head of Performance, with the decision of the Technical Director being final in the event of disagreement.

## **SECTION 6: GENERAL PROVISIONS**

### **Appeals**

41. Athletes may appeal their non-selection, but only after the relevant final selection date and according to the procedure laid out in the “UK Athletics Selection Fast Appeals Procedure” which can be found on the UK Athletics website and which is subject to change. Athletes wishing to seek advice regarding the appeals process (including the validity of any procedure itself) are advised to contact the UK Athletics Athletes’ Commission at [www.uka.org.uk/governance/uk-athletics-athletes-commission/](http://www.uka.org.uk/governance/uk-athletics-athletes-commission/) or WCP athletes can contact the British Elite Athletes Association via [support@britisheliteathletes.org](mailto:support@britisheliteathletes.org).
42. All athletes wishing to be selected pursuant to this Selection Policy agree, as a condition of consideration for selection, that the UK Athletics Selection Fast Appeals Procedure is to be treated as an arbitration procedure under Part 1 of the Arbitration Act 1996 (the “Act”) and amounts to a binding arbitration agreement for the purposes of section 6 of the Act. The seat of the Arbitration shall be England and the Procedure shall be governed by English law.

43. The Relevant Timeline (as defined in the UK Athletics Selection Fast Appeals Procedure) is:

**If you have not been notified of your selection by the time stated above, you have not been selected. Should you wish to appeal your non-selection, you should carefully note the deadlines set out above. There is no obligation on UK Athletics to notify you of your non-selection.**

### **Amendment**

44. UK Athletics reserves the right to amend this Selection Policy at any time in its sole discretion and will make any amended version publicly available (including the date on which any amendment was made) at [www.britishathletics.org.uk](http://www.britishathletics.org.uk)

### **Governing law**

45. This Selection Policy shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the law of England and Wales.

### **Jurisdiction**

46. Any dispute or claim (other than appeals) arising out of or in connection with this Selection Policy shall be submitted for determination exclusively to arbitration under the auspices of Sports Resolutions (UK) Limited and subject to the procedural control of the English Courts

## **Appendix 1: Eligibility Criteria**

- a. Be eligible to compete for GB&NI (i.e. full British passport holder);
- b. Hold an active World Para Athletics License, valid for the 2024 calendar year;
- c. By midnight (BST) 7<sup>th</sup> April, hold either a World Para Athletics (“WPA Athletics”) “Confirmed” or “Fixed Term Review” (with a review date of 1<sup>st</sup> January 2025 or later) classification or in exceptional circumstances, a World Para Athletics “Review” or “Fixed Term Review (with a review date of 1<sup>st</sup> January 2024) or a UK Athletics National Classification, in an eligible class (as listed in the Para Athletics Paris 2024 Medal Event Programme). Any such classification must be underpinned by a Relevant Diagnosis (as defined below) which is to the satisfaction of the UK Athletics Lead Paralympic Medical Officer. For the avoidance of doubt, these requirements apply to all athletes seeking nomination under this Selection Policy, including those with a physical, visual or intellectual impairment.

*Note: F40 and F41 athletes are subject to an annual review until the age of 18 years. This means that athletes in F40 and F41 classes must be at least 18 years of age to hold a Confirmed classification. As such, F40 or F41 athletes who turn 18 after 7<sup>th</sup> April, can still be considered for selection as long as their international classification annual review is completed before the start of the first day of the WPA Championships.*

- d. For athletes who possess a WPA or UK Athletics National classification, any such classification must also be underpinned by a Relevant Diagnosis (as defined below) which is to the satisfaction of the UK Athletics’ Lead Paralympic Medical Officer in accordance with the below. For the avoidance of doubt, these requirements apply to all athletes seeking selection under this Selection Policy, including those with a physical, visual or intellectual impairment;
- e. Be 14 years or older as of 31<sup>st</sup> December 2024;
- f. Not currently serving a period of ineligibility or a provisional or permanent suspension for a doping violation or for any other reason of misconduct;
- g. Meet the standards and behaviour expected by UK Athletics, as published from time to time, including in the International Athletes Code of Conduct;
- h. Be registered as a member with the relevant Home Country Athletics Federation (HCAF), directly or through a club;
- i. Sign the UK Athletics Team Members’ Agreement (“TMA”) and abide by its terms and conditions. Any athlete failing to do so prior to the first date of competition will result in their selection being withdrawn. ## **Relevant Diagnosis**

The Lead Paralympic Medical Officer must be satisfied that a medical diagnosis underpins an athlete's classification (such a diagnosis being a "Relevant Diagnosis") and must be

satisfied that the impairment diagnosed causes permanent and verifiable physical, visual or intellectual activity limitation consistent with the athlete's classification. The following provisions shall apply in connection with the Lead Paralympic Medical Officer's assessment of a Relevant Diagnosis:

- a. it shall be the responsibility of the athlete to obtain and provide documentary evidence of a Relevant Diagnosis so as to show to the satisfaction of the Lead Paralympic Medical Officer that the impairment causes permanent and verifiable physical, visual or intellectual activity limitation consistent with the athlete's classification;
- b. the athlete shall comply with all reasonable requests of the Lead Paralympic Medical Officer for further evidence of the Relevant Diagnosis, and the costs of obtaining such further evidence shall be met by UK Athletics;
- c. all documentary evidence submitted in support of a Relevant Diagnosis must be in English, dated and signed by a registered medical professional who provided the diagnosis; and
- d. the Lead Paralympic Medical Officer's decision in assessing a Relevant Diagnosis shall be final.
